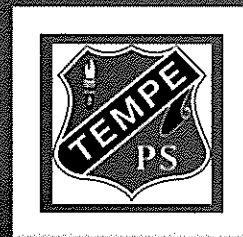

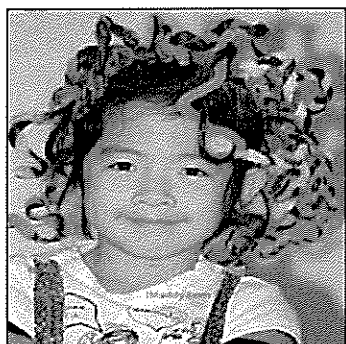

World Refugee Day - 20 June

This day was first observed internationally in 2001 although previously many countries had celebrated a refugee day. The United Nations established the United

Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) in 1950 and this organisation has since been active in assisting the world's refugees and other displaced peoples.

Winter Solstice – 21 June

Today marks the shortest day (in daylight hours) of the year in the southern hemisphere.

International Olympic Day – 23 June

This day commemorates the birth of the modern day Olympic Movement. On this day in 1894, Pierre de Coubertin established the International Olympic Committee.

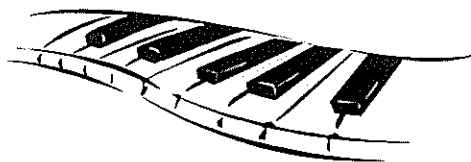
International Day in Support of Victims of Torture – 26 June

This day was officially proclaimed by the United Nations in 1997. Torture and other degrading forms of punishment are among the most abhorrent violations of human rights and dignity. This day emphasises the importance of speaking out against torture, remembering those who suffer from torture, paying tribute to those who combat it and helping victims to overcome physical and psychological pain.

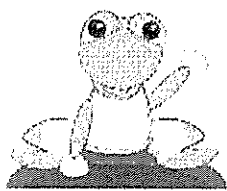
