

LEARNING AREAS

ENGLISH

<u>Reading and Viewing:</u> Students will participate in daily whole class reading, guided reading and independent reading tasks. Students will develop their reading skills and extend their vocabulary and understanding of the texts. Students will participate in modelled reading lessons focused on informative texts (online and printed texts).


<u>Writing and Representing</u>: Learning experiences this term will focus on writing to inform. Students will learn the structure and language features of informative texts and apply this in a variety of writing opportunities. They will also participate in weekly 'short burst writing' lessons where students experiment with creative word play to engage their audience. In Term 1 Spelling lessons, students will be focusing on the short vowel sound in the middle of a word (e.g. hen, shell, clock, tuck) and about which letter combinations make a long e sound (e.g. ee in tree, ea in beach, e_e in Pete). Students will be provided with opportunities to develop fluency in their letter formation and form letters correctly using the NSW foundation style writing.

Speaking and Listening: Students will take part in weekly news presentations and class discussions on a daily basis.



MATHEMATICS

Students will participate in hands-on activities designed to develop their understanding and mathematical reasoning with 2- and 3-digit numbers, and explore strategies for adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing using concrete materials. Students will create increasing and decreasing patterns in algebra, model halves and quarters in fractions, measure and estimate length and area in measurement and identify properties of two- and three-dimensional space. Students will continue to participate in class Number Talk sessions utilising mathematical language and a range of effective problem-solving strategies.



SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

In Term One, students will explore how living things change as they grow over time and reproduce. Students will investigate the lifecycles of minibeasts and record the changes through diagrams.

Students will discover how living things play a key role in our everyday life. They will identify plants and animals that are grown and used for food production and fibre. Students will learn about the plants and animals used in customary practices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples as well as exploring the tools and equipment used to prepare food hygienically for healthy eating.

This unit involves students working scientifically and using scientific thinking.




HISTORY

History will be covered in class next term.

GEOGRAPHY

During Geography, students will investigate weather, climate, and seasons as an example of natural features of places. They will describe the features of a familiar place and explore how places and activities are affected by the weather and climate. Students will learn how different cultural groups, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples describe weather and seasons. They will apply their knowledge of weather, seasons and climate to research natural hazards which affect Australia.



CREATIVE ARTS

Various exciting art, music and drama activities relating to literacy and other units of work are planned.







PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION (PDHPE)

Personal Development: Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) lessons will be taught in class.

<u>Health</u>: Students will describe their own and others' strengths and achievements and identify how these contribute to personal identity. They will explore different groups they belong to and identify the qualities and characteristics that make them similar and different to others. Students will access stories where characters demonstrate strength and discuss how these help the character achieve positive outcomes. Students will also be given opportunities to develop their knowledge and understanding of ways to make positive decisions about their health, safety and wellbeing. They will discuss situations where they are required to make healthy and/or safe decisions in situations around road safety.

<u>Physical Education</u>: Fitness and sport groups focusing on the fundamental movement skills and dance (Mr Haddad and class teacher).





GENERAL INFORMATION

Assemblies

Due to Covid-19 restrictions, whole school assemblies will not be taking place in Term 1. Instead, stage-based assemblies will be held fortnightly. Unfortunately, parents are not able to participate at this stage. Photographs will be taken of merit award recipients and shared via Class Dojo.

Lunches

We encourage that you send a healthy lunch and recess as well as a water bottle to school with your child. Please be aware that some children in the class have food allergies, it will be very much appreciated if you don't send food and snacks to school containing nuts and eggs. For this reason, students do not share food at school. Please also label your child's lunch box and drink bottle.

<u>Birthdays</u>

When it is your child's birthday, parents have the OPTION to drop off a small treat, e.g. cupcakes, for the class to share. Please keep in mind that we are unable to organise the cutting of whole cakes in a classroom setting. Food is not to contain NUTS or EGGS due to allergies.

Playground

Your child will need their school hat every day to play in all areas of the playground. Please ensure that your child's name is clearly written on all their belongings.

<u>Class Dojo</u>

Across the school, Class Dojo continues to be used as a communication platform between parents and classroom teachers. Messages will be responded to in a timely manner but please be aware the classroom teacher's main focus each day is teaching your child. Messages that require an urgent response need to occur through the office via phone call.

Absences

If your child is absent from school, you need to notify the school office. If you would like to, you may also let the teacher know through Class Dojo as a courtesy. After three days of unexplained absence, a note or medical certificate will need to be provided to the school.

Parent Helpers

At this stage we are unable to welcome back parent helpers to our classrooms. We will notify families as soon as we receive any updated information.

Spare Clothes

Please pack a spare change of clothes including underwear and socks in your child's bag in case it is required.

School E-News

Please ensure that you have downloaded the School E-News Application, as this is where you will be able to find the fortnightly "Tempe Talk" Newsletter. Important information is also sent out via this App.

Library

Stage 1 classes will be visiting the library each week for a library lesson with Mrs Costello. Books will be borrowed weekly, starting from Week 3, Monday 7th February. Please ensure that your child returns their book each week. They will require a library bag in order to borrow books, however, they may use their home reading bags if preferred.

Physical Education

Sport lessons will be held weekly with Mr Haddad. Children are to wear their sport shoes to school on their P.E day (please see below table).

Homework Program

Our Homework Program will begin in Week 4 on Monday, 14th February. Our program includes Home Reading and News preparation.

<u>Home Reading -</u> Children are encouraged to read every night for homework. In Stage 1, children take home 1-3 home readers each Monday and return these to school the following Monday. They are encouraged to read each text more than once throughout the week. Each time your child reads, the date, title of the book and a parent signature is recorded in the Home Reading Log. The level of the book that is sent home will be identified by the classroom teacher through assessment and learning opportunities and should be at your child's 'independent' level which means they can read it with minimal assistance.

<u>News Days -</u> As part of our Speaking and Listening program, we have News Days. Your child will be designated a News Day and given the topics to be spoken about. This will begin in Week 4 on Monday, 14th February. Your child is yet to receive their allocated day.
